

# BERNAT® HANDICRAFTER COTTON

# DISHCLOTH (TO CROCHET)



#### **MEASUREMENTS**

Approx 9 ins [23 cm] square.

## **MATERIALS**

**Bernat**® **Handicrafter Cotton** (50 g/1.75 oz)

Summer Splash (23743)	1	ball
or Playtime (23741)	1	ball
or Hot Green (13712)	1	ball
or Hot Orange (13628)	1	ball

Size 5.5 mm (U.S. I or 9) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.

### **GAUGE**

14 sts and 14 rows = 4 ins [10 cm] in pat.

### **INSTRUCTIONS**

Ch 32.

**1st row:** (RS). 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. \*Ch 1. Miss next ch. 1 sc in next ch. Rep from \* to end of ch. Turn. 31 sts.

**2nd row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in first sc. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. \*Ch 1. Miss next sc. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. Rep from \* to last sc. 1 sc in last sc. Turn.

**3rd row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in first sc. \*Ch 1. Miss next sc. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. Rep from \* to last 2 sc. Ch 1. Miss next sc. 1 sc in last sc. Turn.

Rep last 2 rows until work from beg measures 9 ins [23 cm], ending with RS facing for next row. Ch 8. Sl st in top of last sc (loop). Fasten off.



# Gramma's Dishcloth

(A variation of Grandmother's Favorite Dishcloth)

Grandmother's Favorite Dishcloth (original designer unknown) is a common pattern among knitters. It is wildly popular as a quick and useful gift, as well as a gateway for non-knitters into the world of knitted goods. I have not knit many of these, although I have knit its close cousin, without the holes. (Instructions for no holes are in parentheses in the pattern below.)

The thing that kept stopping me from knitting more of this loved and treasured-by-many dishcloth pattern is a symmetry issue. Starting with a cast-on of 4, then going right into the holes, up to a 44 stitch row, then turning immediately to decrease back to 4 before binding off gave me mismatched corners and angles that were mildly "off"...and I couldn't like it.

Here's my solution. You will notice that it is VERY similar, but also different. Maybe you'll like it too.

#### The Code:

**vo** = varn over

**k2tog** = knit two stitches together

**Kf&b** = knit into the front and back of the next stitch

ssk = slip the next two stitches, one at a time, as if to knit, then knit them both together, through the back loop.

#### The materials:

Worsted weight cotton yarn (Sugar and Cream used in sample), approx. 1 oz. Knitting needles, size 7 (or whatever size gives you the size/fabric/drape you like)

#### The pattern:

Cast on 3 stitches.

Knit one row.

K1, Kf&b, K1.

\*K2, yo, knit to end.\* (For no holes, \*K1, kf&b, knit to end.\*)

Repeat from \* to \* until there are 45 stitches on your needle.

K2, yo, k2tog, knit to end; repeat this row two more times. (Knit three rows plain for no holes.)

^K1, ssk, yo, k2tog, knit to end.^ (For no holes,^K2, k2tog, K to end.^) Repeat from ^ to ^ until 5 stitches remain.

K2, k2tog, K1.

K1, k2tog, K1 (3 stitches remain).

Bind off, cut yarn and weave in ends at corners.

Well, there you have it. A simple dishcloth (or face cloth, or wash cloth), based on odd numbers at the beginning, middle and end. Now I can sleep at night. And you? You go find some dishes to wash!








#### **GAUGE**

13 **single crochet** (sc) and 14 rows = 4" [10 cm].



#### **YARN**

Lily<sup>®</sup> Sugar'n Cream<sup>®</sup> (Solids: 2.5 oz/70.9 g; 120 yds/109 m)

#### **COLORS**

Quantity

#### **VERSION I**

Main Color (MC) Tangerine (01699)
 1 ball

#### **VERSION II**

- Contrast A White (00001)
  1 ball
- Contrast B Rose Pink (00046)
  1 ball
- Contrast C Tea Rose (00042)1 ball

#### **TOOLS**

- Size U.S. H/8 (5 mm) Susan Bates® Silvalume® crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.
- Susan Bates® yarn needle.
- Tape measure.

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

Approx = Approximately Beg = Beginning **Ch** = Chain(s)

**Rep** = Repeat **RS** = Right side **Sc** = Single crochet

**Pat** = Pattern

**Tog** = Together WS = Wrong side **Yoh** = Yarn over hook

St(s) = Stitch(es)

#### INSTRUCTIONS

#### **USING THIS GUIDE**

Click on the underlined words throughout the pattern to access our library of helpful tools.

#### MEASUREMENT

Approximately (approx) 8" [20.5 cm] square.


#### **Version I:**

With MC, make a slip knot and place it on the hook.

# Slip knot

Make a loop with yarn and fold it on itself to make a pretzel shape.

Then draw through to make slip knot.




Chain (ch) 26.

### Chain

\*Yarn over hook (Yoh), draw through loop - 1 chain made.


Repeat (rep) from \* 25 times more - 26 chains made.



**1st row:** 1 single crochet (sc) in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each ch to end of **chain**. Turn.

# **Single crochet**

Insert hook into 2nd ch from hook. Yoh and draw up a loop. Yoh and draw through both loops on hook – 1 sc made.





#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

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
St(s) = Stitch(es)

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

Rep last steps in each ch to end of **chain** - 25 sc made. Turn.

**Note:** There will be 25 sc in 1st row [1st skipped ch does not count as stitch (st)].

**2nd row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc to end of row. Turn. Repeat (Rep) last row until work from beginning (beg) measures approx 8" [20.5 cm].



#### Turn

#### **Fasten off**

To fasten off the yarn, cut yarn leaving a long tail. Pull end through loop on hook and pull gently to tighten.

Weave in all yarn tails.



**Version II:** Work as given in Version I in Stripe Pattern (Pat) as follows:

**Stripe Pat:** With A: 1 row With B: 3 rows With A: 5 rows With C: 3 rows With A: 4 rows

These 16 rows form Stripe Pat.

**Note:** To change color, work to last 2 loops on hook and draw new color through last 2 loops, then proceed in new color.
