

## CROCHET SEAFARER'S CAP

pattern by Beth Hall

Chain 45 loosely.

**ROW 1:** Slip st in second chain from hook and next 5 chs, sc in next 6 chs, hdc in next 16 chains, slip st in last 16 chs. [44 st] Ch 1, turn.

Starting with row 2 and all following rows, work all stitches in the back loop only.

**ROW 2:** Slip st in the first 16 slip st of the previous row, ch 1, turn. Slip st in the 16 slip st just completed (working back towards lower edge; these will create the cap's "ribbing"), ch 1, turn. Slip st in the 16 slip st just completed, hdc in the next stitch from row 1 and next 15 stitches, sc in next 6 st, slip st in the next 3 stitches, ch 1 turn leaving the last 3 slip stitches unworked. [41 st]

**ROW 3:** Slip st in the next 3 st, sc in next 6 st, hdc in next 16 st, slip st in last 16 st. [41 st] Ch 1, turn.



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### ABOUT THIS PATTERN

The perfect watch cap for crocheters!

### MATERIALS

300 yds worsted Approx. 200 yds  
worsted weight yarn

Size H hook  
(or size needed to achieve gauge)

### GAUGE

11 hdc = 4"  
2 rows hdc = 1"

**ROW 4:** Slip st in the first 16 slip st of the previous row, ch 1, turn. Slip st in the 16 slip st just completed (back towards lower edge to create the cap's "ribbing"), ch 1, turn. Slip st in the 16 slip st just completed, hdc in the next stitch from row 3 and next 15 stitches, sc in next 6 st, slip st in the next 3 stitches, then slip st in last 3 unworked stitches from row 1. [44 st] Ch 1, turn.

**ROW 5:** Slip st in the next 6 st, sc in next 6 st, hdc in next 16 st, slip st in last 16 st. [44 st] Ch 1, turn.

Repeat rows 2-5, 12 times, ending with row 5, for a total of 53 rows, or to desired size. Break off yarn, leaving a long enough tail to sew the side seam and close the top. Sew side seam, catching the remaining side of the starting chain and the back loop of the last row. At top of hat, secure seam, then use a yarn needle to "catch" top of slip stitch for each row; gather tightly and secure. Weave any yarn ends in to finish.

# Knitting Club Flat Hat

This is a great beginner hat knit flat that will have you knit and purl on the same row, increase, decrease and seam. This hat is sized for an 18" (20)" head, but can be adjusted by increasing or decreasing CO sts in amounts of 4. Note: Larger size is in parenthesis. Highlight correct pattern marking to follow the size intended. Gauge is 4sts x 6 rows = 1"

## Materials:

- Worsted weight yarn
- Straight US 8 needles
- Tape measure or ruler
- Darning needle for seaming

## Terminology:

- CO – Cast on
- St(s) – Stitch(es)
- RS – Right Side Row
- WS – Wrong Side Row
- K – Knit
- P – Purl
- KFB – Knit into the front and back of the same stitch, increasing stitch count by one
- K2tog – Knit two stitches together, decreasing stitch count by one
- \* \* – Repeat directions between \* \* until one stitch remains

## Directions:

CO 74(82) sts

### Ribbing:

Row 1 (RS): K1 \* K2, P2 \*, P1

Repeat this row 7 more times

### Hat body:

Row 9 (RS): K1 \* K8(9), KFB \*, K1 (82 [90] sts on needle)

Row 10 (WS): Purl

Row 11 (RS): Knit

Repeat rows 10 & 11 until hat measures 6" from beginning, ending your last row with a WS row  
(If you want to make a slouchy hat, knit for 2"-4" longer, depending on how slouchy you would like it)

### Crown Decrease:

Row 1 (RS): K1 \* K8(9), K2tog \* K1 (74 [82] sts remain)

Row 2: Purl

Row 3: K1 \* K7(8), K2tog \* K1 (66 [74] sts remain)

Row 4: Purl

Row 5: K1 \* K6(7), K2tog \* K1 (58 [66] sts remain)

Row 6: Purl

Row 7: K1 \* K5(6), K2tog \* K1 (50 [58] sts remain)

Row 8: Purl

Row 9: K1 \* K4(5), K2tog \* K1 (42 [50] sts remain)

Row 10: Purl

Row 11: K1 \* K3(4), K2tog \* K1 (34 [42] sts remain)

Row 12: Purl

Row 13: K1 \* K2(3), K2tog \* K1 (26 [34] sts remain)

Row 14: Purl

Row 15: K1 \* K1(2), K2tog \* K1 (18 [26] sts remain)

Row 16: Purl

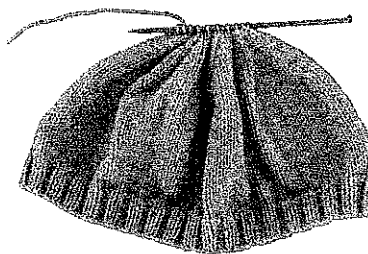
\*\* Note: For 18" size, skip to Row 19 \*\*

Row 17: K1 \* K1, K2tog \* K1 (18 sts remain)

Row 18: Purl

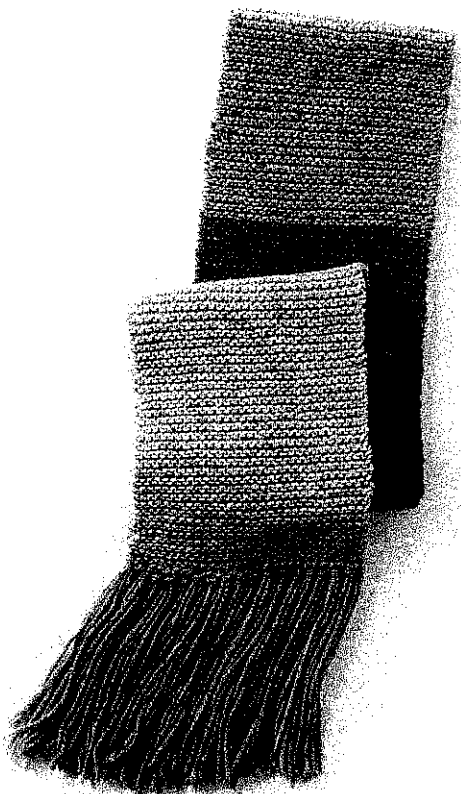
Row 19: K1 \* K2tog \* K1 (10 sts remain)

Break yarn, leaving 12" tail. Use needle & weave yarn through remaining 10 stitches. Seam side of hat. Weave in beginning and ends of yarn. Cut remaining yarn.

#### MATERIALS

**Caron® Cakes™** (7.1 oz/200 g; 383 yds/350 m)

Bumbleberry (17016)

**1 ball**

Size U.S. 8 (5 mm) knitting needles or size needed to obtain gauge.

#### ABBREVIATIONS

**Approx** = Approximate(ly)

**Beg** = Beginning

**St(s)** = Stitch(es)

**Tog** = Together

KNIT | SKILL LEVEL: **BEGINNER**

#### MEASUREMENTS

Approx. 7" x 70" [18 x 178 cm],  
excluding fringe.

#### GAUGE

17 sts and 32 rows = 4" [10 cm] in  
garter stitch.

#### INSTRUCTIONS

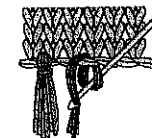
Cast on 30 stitches (sts).

Knit every row (garter stitch)  
until work from beginning (beg)  
measures 70" [178 cm].

Cast off.

#### Fringe

Cut strands of yarn 18" [45.5 cm]  
long. Taking 2 strands together  
(tog), fold in half and knot into  
fringe across ends of Scarf. Trim  
fringe evenly.



Adult length - 70" - 80"  
Child length - 40" - 50"



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## CROCHET SCRAPPY SCARF

Finished Size: 6 1/2" x 60"

Row 1: Chain 200 with color A. Chain 2, turn.

Row 2: Double crochet into 3rd chain. DC in each stitch until end of row. Cut yarn with 5" tail

Row 3: Using color B, pull the new yarn through the top loop of the last DC. Chain 2. DC into 3rd stitch and in each stitch until end of row. Cut yarn with 5" tail.

Row 4: Repeat as for row 3 but with color C.

Row 5: Repeat as for row 3 but with A

Continue in this manner until scarf measures 6.5-7" wide. Secure yarn ends of all rows. Enjoy!

Note: When fastening ends, be sure to tighten the turning stitches.

### MATERIALS

Approx. 75 yds. (2oz) each of 3 colors  
of worsted weight yarn

Size G hook  
(or size needed to achieve gauge)

### GAUGE

4 dc stitches=1 inch
